



# Colonel Abraham Bowman

Officer and Commander of the 8th Virginia Regiment of Foot

"The German Regiment"

Much has been written about the famous German Regiment raised in the highlands of the Shenandoah Valley under command of the "Fighting Parson" Colonel John Peter Gabriel Muhlenberg. The original regiment was only in existence a few years, yet saw the worst of it. Not much has been written about its second commander and one who saw battles, defeat and victory but also was a spectator for the dawn of a new nation.

Born to George Bowman and Mary Hite(the eldest daughter of Jost Hite), Abraham was raised on the family farm on Cedar Creek, just north of Strasburg, Virginia. He received an early education in warfare in defence of the home-steads against indian raiding parties in the 1760's.

Hearing from a neighbor's daughter of a raid on her family, he took rifle in hand and rode to meet the danger. Arriving too late to save the Miller family, he joined with Thomas Newell in pursuit of the indian party who had taken Rachel Dellinger as well. He succeeded in rescuing Rachel after killing one of the raiders.

Just prior to the War of the American Revolution, he was serving as a Justice of the Peace in Shenandoah County(1772-1775). Enlisting in the Virginia Militia as war approached, he received a commission as Lt. Colonel from the Virginia Convention on January 12th, 1776.



He became an officer in the 8th Virginia Regiment and marched with the unit to Charleston, SC where the unit took part in the Battle of Ft. Sullivan. The 8th Virginia then marched north to join the Grand Army and took part in the campaigns of Brandywine, Germantown, White Marsh and spent the winter at Valley Forge.

After Muhlenberg was promoted to Brigadier General, Bowman was raised to a full Colonel and put in charge of the 8th Virginia Regiment. According to his pension papers in the National Archives, "*I was promoted to command of said regiment and that I continued to service in the said regiment from the time of my appointment until after the Battle of Monmouth in June 1778 when a consolidation of regiments took place and many of the junior officers became supernumerary. At that time I was ordered by Brigadier General Scott to return to Virginia and call upon the*

Governor of Virginia(Patrick Henry) for many to recruit the regiment and having called upon him, he told me that the state's quota had been given out before I had made the application and certified it upon my order. I then remained an officer during the war without being again called into service. "

His account of his service was confirmed by Major General Peter Muhlenberg in 1784 and also by Lt. Col. Jonas Clark of the 8th Virginia Regiment in 1810.

For his 6 years of service in the Revolutionary War, Abraham received a land grant for 7,590 acres in the area of Virginia that would become Kentucky a few years after the war.

In 1779, he left Virginia for Kentucky at the head of a vanguard of 30 families. They soon settled in Kentucky near Lexington and established Bowman Station.

He soon met and married Sarah Henry whose family came to Kentucky from Pennsylvania. They had seven children together.

He was elected to the first bench of justices in Lincoln County, Kentucky. Bowman was active in politics and he represented Kentucky in the first Constitutional Convention. Later he represented Fayette County in the Kentucky Constitutional Convention.

He died at his estate near Lexington, Kentucky in late 1837, aged 88. His wife Sarah later applied for additional pension support based on a discrepancy between treasury records which listed his service as being one year longer than previously stated. The pension application was denied.

Colonel Abraham Bowman was the great grandfather of Abram Bowman, founder of Virginia's A. Smith Bowman Distillery.

# February Meeting Guest Speaker COLONEL JOHN C. CASSERINO

Colonel Casserino entered the Air Force in May 1981 upon graduation from the United States Air Force Academy, where he completed two degrees in Astronautical Engineering and Engineering Sciences.



He holds two Master of Science degrees, one from Stanford University and one from Michigan Technological University.

Since graduation, he has served in a wide variety of space operations, engineering, and operations analysis positions for the Air Force and within the National Reconnaissance Office. He also served as program manager for technical research and development initiatives in support of the Airborne Laser program.

His space and technical experiences included a 3-year assignment to an overseas satellite operations site.

He previously served as the Commander, AF ROTC Detachment 400 at Michigan Technological University in Houghton Michigan, where he led over 80 cadets and a staff of seven in the responsibility of recruiting, training and commissioning the next generation of Air Force officers.

He became the Deputy System Program Manager for the Air and Space Operations Center Weapons Systems in May 2003 leading a 200 person team in the development, test, fielding, and sustainment of the Theater Battle Management Core System (TBMCS) for Air Force, Navy, Army, and Marine Corps users plus related development and integration activities as co-chair of an international US-UK Air Battle Management Steering Group.

He is currently an Advanced Aerospace instructor at Randolph Macon Military Academy with a focus on preparing students for advancement to the US Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs, Colorado.
