

At the VASSAR Annual Meeting held at the Omni Hotel in Richmond February 11-12, the Colonel James Wood Chapter was once again named the Best Large Chapter in the State of

Virginia. It's the 7th Best Chapter Award in ten years and a string of six awards in a row for the Large Chapter Category.

The Chapter received a host of other awards prior to receiving the top honor, including the Chapter Excellence Streamer, History Day Support, membership growth and seven Forgotten Patriot Stars. The Chapter was also recognized for Flag Day Support and support for out-going President Mike Elston's Presidential Initiatives for 2017.



Four members of the Chapter attended the meetings over the weekend and had lunch together, Past Presidents Rob Andrews and Don Dusenbury, Current President Dale Corey and 1st Vice President Marc Robinson.

During the General Meeting held on Saturday, Past President Rob Andrews gave the assembled members a three-minute long summary of the Chapter's efforts over the past year including its major successes in the Poster Contest Entries and holding of Patriots Pride Day the previous summer.

The members then boarded buses for the State Capitol where the Annual Awards Ceremony was held in the Old House Chamber.


I hope to expand our Graves Registration and Preservation Program, ensuring we recognize our ancestors and the role they played in laying the foundation for us and our way of life.



A Brief History of the Continental Regiments and Companies of Virginia

The Virginia Line, those men from who came forth to defend our liberty in the turbulent era of the American Revolution came into being in a haphazard fashion and under trying times. Knowing of the outbreak of war in the New England States and prodded by the fiery rhetoric of Patrick Henry, the Virginia Convention voted to raise 15 companies of men in August of 1775.

These companies were then formed into two regiments under the commands of Patrick Henry and William Woodford. The Continental Congress wasted no time in investing them as the 1st Virginia (Henry) and the 2nd Virginia(Woodford).

The 1st Virginia Regiment being placed under the command of Patrick Henry was a forgone conclusion as he had earlier led a company of militia to Williamsburg after Lord Dunmore seized the armory and the gunpowder it contained leaving the militia guarding the Capitol of Virginia defenseless. Henry forced its return and shortly thereafter Lord Dunmore had left Williamsburg in fear of his life. A few months later, Patrick Henry became the 1st post-colonial Governor of Virginia.

In December of 1775, the Continental Congress called on Virginia to raise four more Regiments. Less than two weeks later, the Second Virginia Convention convened and issued a call for 72 additional companies to join the original 15 already commissioned. These companies were formed into the 1st through 9th Virginia Regiments, including the famous 8th Virginia Regiment under the command of Col. Peter Muhlenberg.

As the war expanded and Congress issued the Declaration of Independence, they also called for even more troops to meet the British might in late 1776. Seeking a total of 88 infantry regiments, Virginia was called upon to increase their quota of regiments to 15. It was then that Col. James Wood, commander of the Frederick County Militia was appointed by General Washington to command the newly formed 12th Virginia Regiment.

Realizing that General Washington had the ability to inspire men to his cause, the Continental Congress gave him the authority to raise an additional 16 Regiments at large throughout the colonies. Three of these at-Large regiments were placed under the commands of Nathaniel Gist, Charles Thruston and William Grayson of Virginia. These companies of men operated under the personal command of General Washington and he used them for special duty and to shore up defenses as needed. Each of these units saw significant duty during the Philiadelphia Campaign of 1777.

The Virginia Line Cont'd.

The arrival in America of Baron von Steuben heralded significant changes in the Army and in May of 1778, Congress ordered the reorganization of the Army.

At this time, the number of regiments was reduced and it was at this time the 8th Virginia from Shenandoah County was disbanded and its remnants rolled into the 4th Virginia. Col. Wood's 12th Virginia regiment was redesignated as the 8th Virginia. It was at this time that Col. Wood became Superintendent of the Convention Army imprisoned at the Albermarle Barracks near Charlottesville, Virginia.

Throughout 1779 the Virginia Line weakened, cracked and due to illness and losses at the surrender of Charleston and the Massacre at Waxhaws nearly ceased to exist in a recognizable form.

In 1781, seeing a glimmer of light in the situation and the end of the war, Congress along with Washington again reorganized the Army and issued a troop quota again for Virginia of eight regiments. The state levied taxes to raise bounty money and three months pay for the newly minted soldiers.

It was these soldiers who were finally enough to finish off the British. Inspired and well led by the Marquis de Lafayette, they helped to defeat them at Cowpens, Kings Mountain, standing toe to toe with them at Guilford Courthouse, harassing them through the siege of Williamsburg, the Battle of Greensprings and the Battle of the Hook.

Finally, the chess game ended as they joined with the French and laid siege to Lord Cornwallis at Yorktown.

She has also held State and National Chairmanships. She is the author of *A Century of Service: The Story of the DAR*, published in 1991 for the centennial of the National Society and now out of print. She also cowrote *The Wide Blue Sash*, published by

Ann's project as State Regent made possible the signature bronze statue of George Mason sculpted by Wendy Ross for George Mason University and dedicated in 1996. A subsequent project provided support to Ferry Farm. She is an Honorary State Regent of the Virginia DAR.

Ann and her husband, Stephen R. Hunter, own and operate Loft Press, Inc., a publishing and publishing services company located in Fort Valley, Shenandoah County. For 15 years, she edited and produced an educational journal, Educational Technology Research and Development, and has edited more than 25 books for Loft Press.

Ann and Steve have been married for 59 years. They have four children, eleven grandchildren, and nine great-grandchildren.
